In 1990, Fr. Michael Lapsley, an Anglican priest, lost both hands and an eye as a result of a letter bomb sent to him during his involvement in the anti-apartheid struggle in South Africa. With the the support of family, friends,, and supporters from around the world, he made the journey from victim to survivor to victor. He worked with the South Africa's Truth and Reconciliation Commission and later founded Institute for Healing of memories.in Cape Town, South Africa. He works internationally in many conflict areas and with others who have experienced trauma of many kinds, and has trained facilitators in the United States and internationally. IHOM has been serving veterans in Arizona, Minnesota, and California, as well as in conflict areas around the world.
